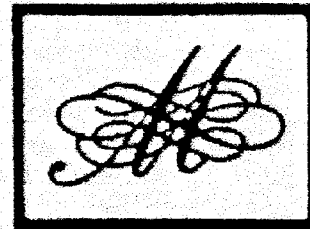

SUBJ: 1997 GTOAA International Meet Information

Friends, here is the first packet of information on our upcoming International Meet, which as you know will be in Atlanta this coming July. I hope this material is helpful to you. More will come as you feedback on the things you'd like to know more about.

In the past, GTOAA has relied on you to sort of take things on faith, and encourage your membership to come to their national convention without much advance information having crossed your desk. I know... I've been in this situation myself. Well, this year and every year hereafter, Lord willing, we're going to try to make information available to you as soon as it becomes known to us, or as soon as I can possibly get it to you.

Of course, there are some things that are in a "maybe" status right now, and I don't want to promise things that aren't "for sure." In order to make many of these things happen at the meet, and to make sure the things you want get into the meet schedule, I'll need you to give me plenty of input. This is your meet -- this event belongs to you and your fellow chapter members. The local chapter here in Atlanta is trying to build an event you'll look forward to attending, and you and your chapter members will be talking about (in a good way!) throughout the year. Their task can be made a whole lot easier with your input.

Our chapter Presidents and officers are the real leadership in GTOAA -- don't forget that. Your chapter members follow your lead. I count on you, the Presidents, to take a lead role in building excitement about your national convention, and encouraging your chapter members to attend and bring their cars. These things are just a tremendous amount of fun, as you well know, and the more of your local chapter members attend, the more energized and motivated your members are in your meetings throughout the rest of the year. Indeed, one of the best ways to grow your local chapter and to build involvement and attendance is to create excitement about participating on a national level. The camaraderie and fellowship among your members who have been to the Nationals together creates momentum for your local chapter that lasts the whole year through.

This material I'm sending you today is something for you to share with your members, to get a feel for the meet location, the schedule, and some of the things we're thinking about doing. Like I said, please let me hear from you, and please talk the meet up in your chapter meetings, to get feedback from your members. If you need anything, or if there is some specific information you'd like for your newsletter, please feel free to contact me. I'll be back in touch with more as we put a few more things together.

Thanks again for all you're doing to keep your chapters growing and keeping GTOAA membership and involvement on the rise. I appreciate all your hard work!

**1997 GTOAA International Meet
Atlanta Marriott Gwinnett Place
July 2 -- 5, 1997**

Preliminary Information

1. Host hotel has 421 rooms -- our room block is 360 rooms. Due to national yearly contracts with area businesses, the hotel is required to maintain 60 rooms available for these clients, but we have the rest of the hotel. No other function is booked into the hotel during this time. In effect, we have "the run of the place."
2. Host hotel has just undergone an \$8 million renovation for the '96 Olympics, and it looks fabulous. The normal posted room rate is \$215/day, but our contract rate with the hotel is \$74/night for a "double/double", up to 4 adults per room. The hotel has an indoor-outdoor pool, a sports bar with a deck right out onto the parking lot, a lobby bar, a family-style restaurant and a "fine dining" restaurant on the premises.
3. You may at this time book rooms in the host hotel. Call the Marriott nationwide reservations line (800) 228-9290. The name of the property is the Atlanta Marriott Gwinnett Place, 1775 Pleasant Hill Road, Duluth, GA 30136. Make sure to say you're with the GTOAA International Meet and give the dates. Our rates will accommodate you if you wish to get there a day early and/or stay a day or two after the meet is over.

PRESIDENTS PLEASE NOTE: In the past our host hotels have noticed that some individuals have block-booked several rooms well in advance of the meet, probably to ensure that their chapter members who "might be" attending would have a room at the host hotel, then cancelled most of these rooms at the last minute when the "might be" members failed to show up. This has caused two big problems: (1) This tended to "sell out" our room block very early on, causing some of our members to be informed that the hotel was full when it really was not; and (2) When the "phantom reservations" were cancelled it threw the hotel's accounting of our room block into a confused mess which affected not only those trying to register for the meet but the rates they paid. This may have affected you and your family.

This year the hotel has informed us that to help eliminate this practice they will not take reservations for more than 2 ROOMS on any one credit card.

We need to make sure that this practice of reserving several rooms, sitting on them until the day before the meet, then cancelling them, is heavily frowned upon in your chapters. If you've ever tried to make reservations for the meet in late May and been told, "Sorry, we're booked," then found out later that walk-ups on the day of the show were getting rooms at the convention rate, you have an idea of how this block-booking screws things up. Please help with this!

4. We really do expect to have a large meet this year, and we do think the Marriott will sell out fairly quickly. Fortunately, there are four other hotels literally on the same property with the Marriott, and we are negotiating with these hotels to provide additional space with an attractive convention rate. There is an Embassy Suites, a Holiday Inn, a Day's Inn and another hotel under construction, which will be finished before the end of 1996. The Embassy Suites hotel's parking lot and the Marriott parking lot adjoin each other, and all four hotels are so close together that you can see the showfield from any of their sleeping rooms. There won't be any hotel space problems at this year's meet, and

even if you do register late and get a room in the overflow hotel, you'll still be right in the middle of everything.

5. Please see the enclosed literature on some of the attractions and nearby shops and services. The hotel is located at the Pleasant Hill Road exit on I-85, 22 miles north of downtown Atlanta. This is the heart of the largest shopping and entertainment complex in the state. Shopping, dining, golf (real golf and miniature), Malibu Grand Prix, a water park, and hundreds of other conveniences are literally a short walk from the hotel. There will be transportation available to the Gwinnett Place Mall and other places. More on this as we get it worked out. This is one of the areas where we need feedback -- what do you want to see, how much is a reasonable shuttle cost, and so forth? Please make your feelings known on this issue.

6. We are pleased to announce The Jim Wangers Invitational Drag Races at the 1997 GTOAA International Meet. Our racing program will welcome some of the nation's finest and fastest Pontiac-powered, Pontiac-bodied automobiles in their own brackets. GTOs still race against GTOs in their own ET brackets. Mr. Jim Wangers will be the official race marshal. Details are still being worked out, but this year's drag racing is a you-gotta-be-there event!

A WORD ABOUT ATLANTA IN JULY -- It's the summer. What do you expect? Let's keep things in perspective, though. It's July everywhere, friends. If we're in the northern hemisphere, we should expect it to be warm. Remember back with me:

1995, Niagara Falls, New York -- 99 degrees in the parking lot.

1994, St. Louis, Missouri -- 96 degrees.

1993, Speedway, Indiana -- tornadoes.

1992, Lincolnshire, Illinois -- Perfect weather. A little rain. What can I tell you?

1991, Louisville, Kentucky -- monsoons

1990, Minneapolis, Minnesota -- It snowed, didn't it? I can't remember.

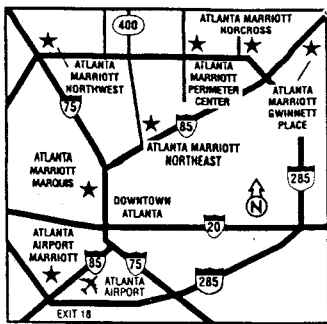
1989, Columbus, Ohio -- 101 degrees.

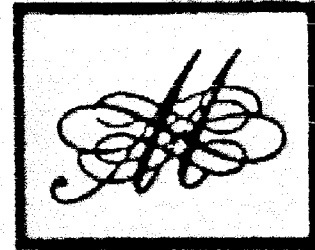

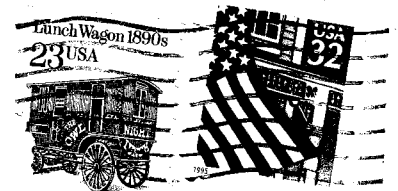
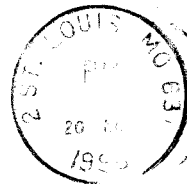
