Take the remote in your hand – sit down and hit rewind





Saturday, August 25, we had 20 members, and 9 cars show up to park and show in a HUGE, roped off, secure area at the Family Arena in St. Charles. We gathered in the parking lot, signed our release paperwork and registered to enter. Upon entry, for sanitary purposes we were given new t-shirts to put on over our shirts and hairnets and beard/mustache covers. (See if you can pick out who attended by the pic below!) It was definitely a "Kodak Moment". We were then sent to a hand washing station and given food service gloves. We were instructed in the procedures to pack the meal that we were packing; apple cinnamon oatmeal.



- We had 10 people to a work station.
- One to hold the plastic bag under the loading funnel
- One to add sugar
- One to add cinnamon
- One to add the dried apple pieces
- One to add the oats
- Two to weigh the bags, and determine if we had too much or too little in the bag and either add/remove the excess
- Two to seal the bags
- One to place the label on the bag and place it in the grid to keep track of the count (And one person to work our 2 stations to actually fold the cardboard carton and add the packaged meal and seal it shut with packing tape)

They had a DJ there spinning some LOUD tunes, and he was running the gamut of genres from "Oldies", to "Christian Rock" to "Rap". There were people of all ages packing and I'm sure they wanted to please everyone..., but we believe they saw the packing pace pick back up when he started "rockin' back out" to the "Oldies"! 
