(Don't even get me started on how much time Jim McCarthy and I spent setting up the email blasts). And then, in the blink of an eye, the week was over.

On many occasions, we all asked each other what are we forgetting? What are we missing? In the end, it looks like the answer to that is almost nothing.

There is a lot to cover to address everything that the Gateway team pulled off for the 2017 GTOAA National convention. The starting point for this, without question, was selecting the right venue for the event. The Hol-





iday Inn, (now Doubletree) hotel that we used for the 2005 convention was too small for what we wanted to accomplish. 


