

John Grissom got a Silver in concourse. Jim Schneider and Dan Jackson both donated their refunded nationals money back to the GTOAA. There were three cars from the Gateway club that were damaged in the storm, two of which were Terry Schott's and John Hunt's. Randy Jones' GTO received the most damage amounting to a serious repair bill. He was given the Best of Show trophy for the classic cars to help ease the pain. For being such an integral part of the show and all of his hard work, Chris Winslow was given the Best in Show for the new gens. This will be the first time Best in Show was given to a GTO that was not present at the nationals. GTO's at the Illinois State Fair

Back in May, Paula and I were up in Pontiac at the Pontiac Museum to participate in a car show sponsored by Midwest Firebirds. That club has consistently been a strong supporter of our annual car show there so I wanted to go up and support one of their events. While we were there, Penny Dye told us that the City of Springfield had reached out and wanted to have some cars for a display at the Route 66 tribute area on the state fairgrounds. They were looking for about 10 cars for the event. That was too large of a showing for the Museum to support and Penny asked if Gateway would be willing to take it on.

I was not sure initially if there would be interest in driving to Springfield for a car show in August. So, I was worried that we might not be able to get to 10 cars. Those concerns turned out to be unwarranted as Gateway members stepped as usual and we actually ended up with 11 cars signed up.





Logistically, it was a tricky thing to organize. We had cars coming from 5 different locations and we all had to meet and go into the fair at the same time. For those of us coming from the St. Louis/St. Charles area, the obvious meeting point was the old Chain of Rocks Bridge parking area. Unfortunately, that is closed due to construction in the area, as is the east-bound entrance onto 270 from Riverview. So, we ended up meeting at the Schnucks off of Bellefontaine road. Gathering there were 4 of our 11 cars. Paula and I, and Brian and Amy O'Sullivan, both in our 2004 GTOs, Tom and Terry Oxler in their 1966 GTO, and Barb and Earl Lewis in their 1967 GTO. We left the parking lot about 7:30 and at that time of the morning traffic was light, so we made good time to Springfield.

The rest of the cars were meeting us at the Schnucks in Springfield near the fair-grounds. This meeting point was based on an excellent recommendation that I received from Melissa Dunbar, with the City of Springfield Convention Team. She knew the area which roads would be one way for the weekend. This lot was ideally suited for a quick hop over to Gate 4 of the fair. Meeting us at that location were a lot of convertibles! There was Alan and Liane Finkenbinder in their GTO Convertible, Dave Sullivan in his Firebird Convertible, Frank and Cheryl in their Judge Convertible, Harry Timmermann in his Lemans Convertible. In addition the Wildebrandts, the Garveys, and the Grissoms met us there with their GTOs.

We made a quick dash from the Schnucks over to Gate 4 where Melissa was waiting to let us in and escort us to the display. Melissa had mailed tickets for everyone to me, but I had not received them so Melissa had replacements for us. (As it turns out, I got the tickets in the mail after we got home. They were postmarked on August 7th. Not sure why it took nearly 2 weeks to go from Springfield II, to O'Fallon Mo!)









Melissa led us to the display on the fairgrounds. There was an entire parking area that had been set aside just of us to show our cars and a great Route 66 display right next to the parking area.

After we got set up many of us explored the Route 66 display. It checked all of the boxes. It had Route 66 signs, billboards, a rest area, a classic hotel and drive in sign, a bridge, and Burma-Shave signs. It even had a tribute to the Giants.

Many of us also took some time while we were there to explore the fair. There was lots to see and plenty of things to eat. Paula and I got some huge ice cream cones at the dairy building and also a funnel cake. (Plenty of time to get back on the diets on Sunday!)

After spending most of the day at the fair, all of us except the Finkenbinders and Dave Sullivan headed back south towards St. Louis. On the way we stopped for dinner. Paula had made reservations several weeks earlier for us at the Ariston Café.


We all had a great dinner at Ariston and Earl became best friends with the young lady that was our server.
